



RESOLUTION BACKGROUND MATERIAL:

The Riverwalk Project in downtown Dover follows the Cocheco River from the Central Avenue bridge to Chestnut Street bridge and will eventually join the Rails-to-Trails project currently underway. The mission is to revitalize this overgrown, neglected area by removing overgrown shrubbery and invasive species and replacing with specific low maintenance plantings, including rhododendrons, groundcovers, as well as others.

Local sculptor, horticulturalist, and philanthropist Joe Parks has given unlimited access to his hybrid rhododendrons and donated one of his bronze sculptures in an effort to transform this forgotten downtown area into a unique specimen garden that will provide a stunning display of scents and color year after year, while helping preserve and protect the natural and cultural heritage of the community.
